Accessible Journey as Real-World Learning

This was not a holiday.

Participants:

- Navigated airports independently
 - Spoke directly with hotel staff, Immigration, etc
 - Managed luggage, timings, and public spaces
- For many, this was their first time handling such systems on their own.

Confidence was built through action.





A Change in Self-Belief

This journey did not just take participants to new cities. It changed how they see themselves.

Before:

- Hesitant to travel alone
- Dependent on family decisions
- Limited peer network
- Fear of public systems

After:

- Navigated airports and hotels confidently
- Clearly expressed accessibility needs
- Active in a peer support community
- Learning AI and digital tools together

One participant who had never travelled independently, checked into a hotel alone during the program.

Today, he mentors new members in the group.

We observed a clear shift:

From being managed → to managing themselves.

From isolation → to belonging.

The impact continues beyond the journey.

Safety Was Our First Priority

Volunteer ratio maintained at 1:3
Pre-travel preparation sessions completed
Clear emergency protocols in place
Zero medical emergencies
Families trusted us with their loved ones.
We carried that responsibility seriously.





7 YEARS EFFORTS TOWARDS INCLUSIVE INDIA

The Problem & Our successful Model

WHO estimates 6.2 crore visually impaired persons in India, including **80 lakh who are completely blind.**

Yet this community arrives without structured exposure to real public systems.

The result is predictable:

- Capability without opportunity
- Talent without testing
- Adults who remain dependent not by choice, but by design

The issue is not blindness.

It is restricted access to lived experience.

When exposure is missing, participation declines.

Mobility is not movement.

It is access to education, employment, and dignity.

This is the gap, RSKC exist to close.



Because of You

Confidence replaced hesitation for 50 individuals.

- **Participants** navigated complex public systems independently
- Families witnessed new levels of self-reliance
- Isolation reduced through a strong peer network
- Mentorship began within the community

At an individual level, self-belief strengthened.

At the **community level**, a support ecosystem formed

– in conversations, decisions, and daily confidence.

– Women participants travelling confidently

It did not create a moment. It created momentum.





Vision 2030: 1,00,000 visually impaired adults Empowered by RSKC.

Extending a Proven Model Beyond Borders

For 7+ years, RSKC has operationalised structured mobility programs across India and other countries.

The model is tested.

The safety architecture is defined.

The community network is active.

The next horizon is deliberate:

- Regional ecosystem strengthening
- Cross-border inclusion exchanges
- Strategic global partnerships
- Knowledge export of India's inclusive mobility framework

This is not expansion for visibility. It is institutionalisation at scale.

With your continued support, India's inclusive mobility model can influence regional and global practice.





Impact at Scale. Representation with Purpose.

Since 2019:

- 1,800+ blind and visually impaired individuals directly empowered
- 10,000+ indirectly impacted through families, communities, and volunteer networks

In Thailand, we represented India in disability-led mobility — invited by the Thailand First School for the Blind under Royal Patronage.

In India, our work has been honoured and featured by **Times Network as one of the country's most inspiring inclusion stories.**

What began as mobility is now positioning India as a serious voice in inclusive, sensory-led tourism.

The community is growing. The direction is global.

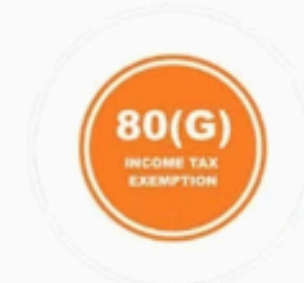
